NOTICE TO PATRONS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – PROHIBITED GOODS

Patrons are requested to note that, under the Conditions of Ticketing and Entry of the Club, no prohibited goods are to be brought on to the racecourse premises.

The following items are considered Prohibited Goods:

- alcoholic beverages;
- sporting goods such as footballs, billiard balls or tennis balls;
- flares or other explosive or flammable goods or equipment;
- firearms, knives or any other implement or item that may be used as a weapon;
- laser pointers; and
- folding or camp chairs and tables.

Please also note that it is a condition of entry to the racecourse premises that all large bags (i.e. bags the size of an A4 sheet of paper or larger) and other carriers (such as drink coolers) are allowed to be searched for Prohibited Goods by the Club's authorised representatives. If found, the Club's authorised representatives will not allow Prohibited Goods to be brought on to the racecourse premises. The Club's authorised representatives may also prohibit entry to the racecourse premises of any person found to be in the possession of a Prohibited Good.

Patrons refusing to allow large bags and other carriers to be searched by the Club's authorised representatives may be prohibited from entering the racecourse premises.

Patrons found on the racecourse premises with Prohibited Goods may be expelled from the racecourse premises.

A person, who in accordance with the Conditions of Ticketing and Entry of the Club, is not admitted to the racecourse premises, or is expelled from the racecourse premises, is not entitled to a refund of any money paid for admission to the racecourse premises.

The Club will take no responsibility for the safekeeping of Prohibited Goods found at the entrances or on racecourse premises.

These measures are in the interest of patron safety and enjoyment, and the co-operation of the public in assisting with these measures is greatly appreciated.

UNDERAGE DRINKING

The Moonee Valley Racing Club takes its responsibilities under Liquor Licensing Laws seriously. As such it has adopted the Consumer Affairs Victoria guidelines of "No Proof: No Purchase". Therefore, on **Tatts Cox Plate day** all young patrons will be required to produce suitable photo identification verifying they are 18 years old or over, before being wrist banded as age verified, to allow purchase and consumption of alcohol.
